A quick note about this event:

Peterborough Motor Sports is holding a tsd rally, called the Salmon River Rally on the same day as the Shannonville Stages. This event is offered to introduce performance rally concepts to tsd rally competitors. While you will be competing on the same roads as the Performance Rally competitors, you will be provided with average speeds and/or elapsed times which you must maintain in order to be successful. These speeds have been set by experienced competitors in order for you to experience some higher speed driving in relatively safe areas on the track but with reduced speeds where it is deemed unsafe for unprepared vehicles to proceed at unregulated speed.

6. Description of Event

This is a **Navigational Rally** including **6 Selective sections** ranging from 14.31 km to 33.66 km to be run on closed paved roads and gravel access roads. This event will utilize multiple variations of the Shannonville Motorsports Circuit and access roads. Total length of the route will be approximately 125 km.

The road is varies from 1 to 3 car widths wide with smooth pavement or gravel bordered in some places by curbs, guardrail, concrete walls and trees. Some portions of the road surface may be wet, icy, or snow covered.

Scheduled rest breaks will occur throughout the event on a varied schedule. There will be only **one** refuelling area (location on attached map.) Commercial fuel is not available at the start location. Fuel is available en route to the start location.

8. Entries

Entries will be accepted as follows:

Until the close of Registration (8:45 a.m. on Saturday, April 12, 2014). The maximum number of entries to be accepted will be 16. Entries in excess of this number will be held in order of receipt.

We do not have provision to accept credit cards.

9. Refunds and Withdrawals

100% of the entry fee will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is received before 18:00, April 9. Entries withdrawn between, April 9, 18:00 and the opening of registration **will** be charged a \$25.00 withdrawal fee. There will be **no refunds** for entries who have not withdrawn by the opening of registration, and who fail to start the rally. Refunds will be paid by cheque after the event.

10. Starting Order

A starting order will be set by the organizer.

11. Vehicle Identification

All competitors will be provided with door/window numbers as required. Competitors will be required to display event and/or sponsor decals as provided by the organizers. Competitors not wishing to display event and/or sponsor decals may do so by paying a surcharge equal to the early entry fee. Marshals will check for decal compliance.

12. Documents

The following documents, valid on the day of the rally, must be available for presentation to the registrar or assistant on request on the day of the event:

- a) Driver's licence for both crew members
- b) Vehicle registration
- c) Vehicle eligibility self declaration
- d) Proof of ownership (or written permission of the owner, if not owned by one of the crew)
- e) Written permission from a parent or guardian for competitors under the age of 18.

13. Eligibility

Crew: a crew is defined as two persons nominated on the official entry form as driver and navigator.

Passengers are not allowed in this event.

- Equipped Class: A vehicle equipped with any device directly connected to the vehicle which can be programmed to provide "live" time distance computations such as a rally computer.
- Unequipped Class: A vehicle which has no direct connection to a device which can be programmed to perform "live" time/speed/distance computations. A handheld calculator is an example.

All vehicles must be road worthy with:

minimum 3 point harness; functioning brake lights functioning directional signal lights

Brief scrutineering for above and decal placement will be held before track entry.

Helmets: Helmets meeting CARS NRR.11.1.6 or bearing "Snell Memorial Foundation"1995 M or1995 SA (or more recent) labels must be worn by all drivers and Co-Drivers. For any vehicle equipped with a Full or Partial cage a helmet with 1995 SA (or more recent) label is required for both members of crew.

14. Awards

Subject to the condition listed below, awards shall be presented to Driver and Navigator for the following: 1st Overall, Equipped, First Overall Unequipped. Trophies will be awarded to the winners of each class where a minimum of three entries have been received by April 1, 2013. Should the entry/sponsorship levels warrant, cash rebates may be made to competitors who have

Should the entry/sponsorship levels warrant, cash rebates may be made to competitors who have registered by the early entry date.

15. Accommodatins

There are many hotels, motels, and resorts in the Belleville, Trenton, and Picton areas.

16. Miscellaneous

Route directions will be by tulip diagram and distance.

The normal 30 minute lateness time will not be used in this event. Should a vehicle become disabled on a selective, it will be towed off the course at the completion of the selective. Scoring will be computed as a regular tsd with missed controls being scored at 20 points

The control zones (Assembly Areas) are labelled on the map included in the route book. Each Assembly Area is an MTC. Competitors may enter early and request their proper time. Competitors must be ready to start upon entering the Assembly . Vehicles will line up in double file and alternate starting. Cars start on 15 second intervals - 30 seconds behind vehicle in line in front of you. Please approach the start line promptly for the countdown.

The "rest" location is at the start/finish of the rally and is the only area where servicing is permitted. This schedule will be outlined in the route book.

All officials of the event (including marshals, radio personnel, traffic control, etc.) shall be deemed judges of fact and as such may point out any infraction these supplemental regulations to the Organizer.

Competitors and service crew are to refrain from using two way radios at the event that may interfere with official event communication and/or scoring.

Updates and clarifications will be posted to the event web page as linked from the official RallySport Ontario web site, <u>www.rallysport.on.ca</u> It is the competitors' responsibility to check this. You may link directly to: <u>http://shannonville.pmsc.on.ca</u>/

Timing will be to the tenth of a second at all open controls as well as the finish control. Your time will be taken as you cross the timing mark as indicated by traffic cones. The score will be computed to the next timing mark. Each second early or late for the elapsed time between timing marks will be a one point penalty. The second starts at the "0.00" mark and ends at the "0.99" second mark. Next time segment begins immediately at the second you finish the previous mark.

The penalty for striking a chicane element will be 15 seconds per element struck. All pylons and barrels delineating the course are each considered one chicane element.

PLEASE NOTE: Competitors who choose to unreasonably ignore the speed limits and proceed in a fashion contrary to the spirit of this event will be black flagged and asked to leave the property immediately. Offenders names will be circulated within the motorsport community. This action may be initiated by any of the judges of fact and will be executed by the clerk of the course. No appeal will be considered
